

Keeping our school community safe through the pandemic – what are we doing in school?

At Sacred Heart we are committed to keeping everyone in our community as safe as we possibly can. We are continuing to ensure that all classrooms and communal areas are well ventilated and completing extra cleaning of common touch points throughout the school day. We are going to have Collective Worships, singing and assemblies in key stages for he first few weeks and evaluate this as the term moves on.

We ask that our families do their bit to. Please do not send your child in if they are symptomatic of COVID 19 and if they are a close contact of a person who has tested positive we strongly advise that a PCR (a test that is sent to a laboratory) test is completed. Your child will not have to self-isolate if they are in contact with a positive case and are welcome into school.

The pupils will not be in bubbles anymore in school unless we have an outbreak and Public Health England ask us to us our Outbreak Management Plan.



After School Clubs

After school clubs are just being finalised and can now be booked through MyEd. A timetable of activities will be sent out later this week.

Classes have started the year off as they mean to go on. Each class have a Recognition Board in their classrooms to positively recognise when members of the class are truly living out our school values.

Adults in the classroom can use positive reinforcement of these values to praise and celebrate your child's behaviour for learning.

House points will also be awarded through Class Dojo to recognise that special effort or when a pupil goes above and beyond demonstrating the values of *Hardworking*, *Enthusiasm*, *Aspirational*, *Respect* and *Togetherness*.


Drop off and collection arrangements
