

St Bernadette Relic Tour 2022

n September and October, the relics of St Bernadette made pilgrimage to England, Scotland and Wales for the first time.

This was a very special, once in a lifetime event that provided an opportunity for people of all ages and backgrounds to pay tribute to St Bernadette in their local church or cathedral.

The OLoL Chaplaincy team hosted and live-streamed a celebration Mass on their YouTube channel and many of our academies attended to venerate St Bernadette's relics.









Protecting lives in all academies



All 36 of our academies now have a defibrillator installed on site.

Defibrillators have the potential to save the lives of pupils, staff and visitors in schools, with latest research showing that accessing these devices within 3-5 minutes of a cardiac arrest increases the chance of survival by over 40%.

The government committed to funding all necessary devices so that every academy has at least one on-site, or more for academies with larger sites.

The rollout will build on existing requirements for academies to teach first aid as part of the curriculum, with secondary school pupils being taught life-saving methods such as CPR and the purpose of defibrillators.

The installations will also help protect our local communities against cardiac arrest, delivering wider access to these devices.

St Augustine's Stamford supports local food hub

George, who decided to set up Second Helpings in Stamford over eight years ago, wanted to establish a large food hub where businesses and families can donate surplus food that would otherwise go to waste.

The Hub is open to the local community in Stamford on a pay as you feel basis, meaning that

there are no restrictions on who can access the hub.

George's Food Hub is manned by volunteers and is open on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 2.45pm–4.15pm.
