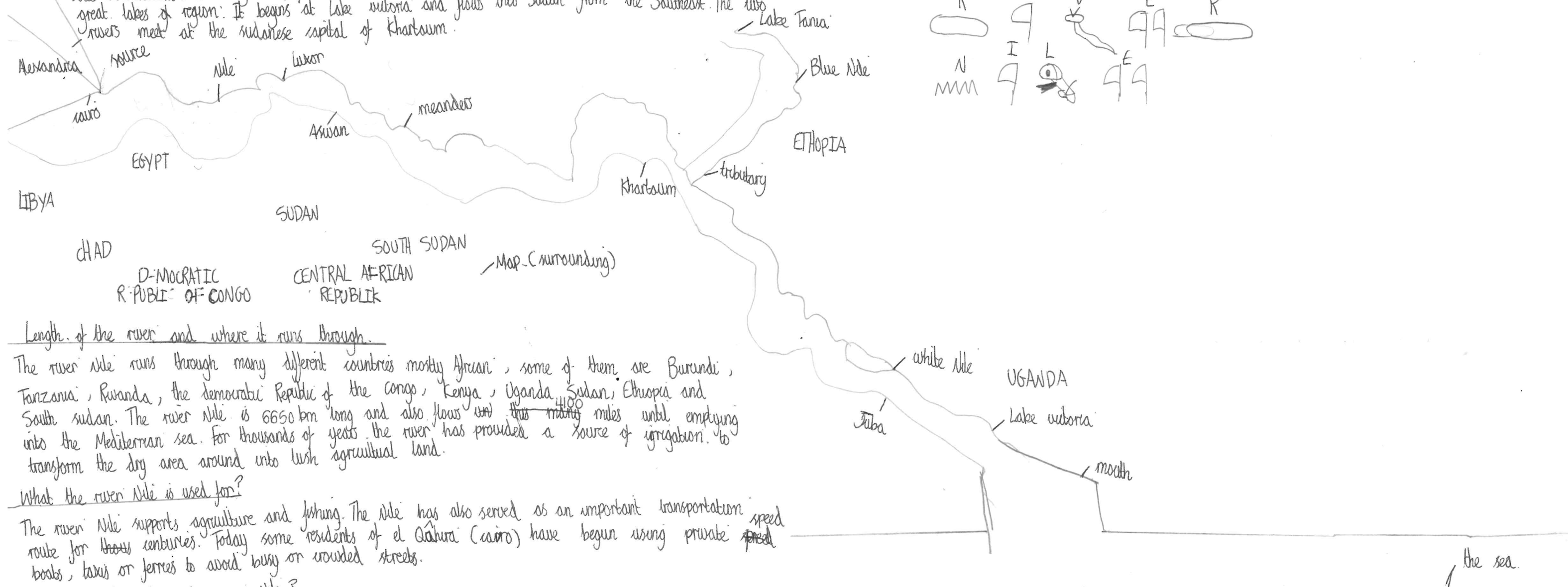
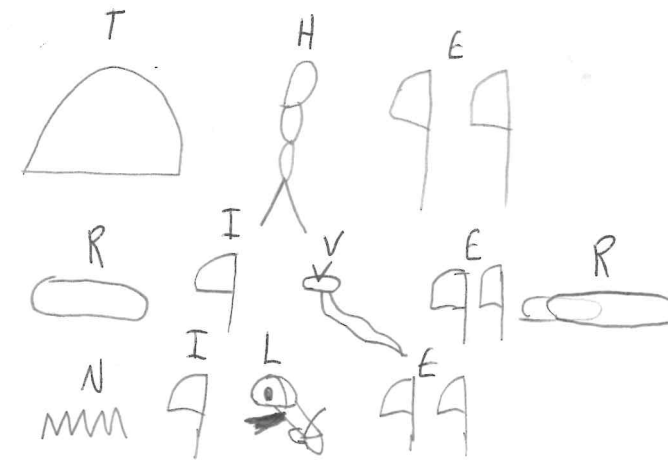


The Nile is a north-flowing river in Northeastern Africa. This river even flows into the Mediterranean sea! Surprisingly, the Nile is the longest river in Africa and has historically been considered the longest in the river in the world, though this has been contested by research. They were suggesting the Amazon river was a tiny bit longer. Of the world's major rivers, the Nile is one of the smallest, as measured by annual flow in cubic meters of water. In particular, the Nile is the primary water source of Egypt, Sudan and South Sudan and additionally is an important economic river. The Nile has two major tributaries - the White Nile and the Blue Nile. The White Nile traditionally considered to be the headwaters stream. However, the Blue Nile is the source of most of the water of the Nile downstream, containing 80% of the water and silt. The White Nile is longer and rises in the great lakes of region. It begins at Lake Victoria and flows into Sudan from the Southeast. The two rivers meet at the Sudanese capital of Khartoum.

The river Nile runs through many different countries mostly African, some of them are Burundi, Tanzania, Rwanda, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Kenya, Uganda, Sudan, Ethiopia and South Sudan. The river Nile is 6650 km long and also flows ~~4100~~ miles until emptying into the Mediterranean sea. For thousands of years the river has provided a source of irrigation to transform the dry area around into lush agricultural land.

What the river Nile is used for?

The river Nile supports agriculture and fishing. The Nile has also served as an important transportation speed route for ~~thous~~ centuries. Today some residents of el Qahira (Cairo) have begun using private ~~speed~~ boats, taxis or ferries to avoid busy or crowded streets.

What animals live in the river Nile?

Lots of varieties of animals live & create a place to live in. Some animals that live in the river Nile are the Nile crocodiles, this is one of the most feared and revered residents of the Nile river, a Nile perch, a Nile soft-shelled turtle, Nile river snakes, African tigerfish and Hippopotamus.
