Over time, these habits translate into higher academic achievement, better career opportunities, and stronger social and emotional well-being.

### After School Club – trial pick up arrangement

As a trial, until 17 October 2025 – half term, children can be collected any time between 3:30 and 4:30pm, offering greater flexibility for families. Parents will be required to press the gate buzzer (near EYFS), and you will be 'buzzed' in, to collect your child. This will require a further member of staff therefore, and as a school, we need to see whether this is manageable or not. We will do our best.
