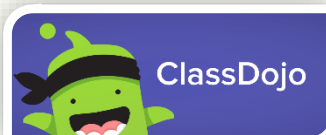
Class Dojo

ClassDojo is an online platform used in primary schools to share learning and celebrate children's school achievements.

Sacred Heart previously used ClassDojo, but its use was paused as it was impacting staff workload. We are now going to reintroduce it in a simpler form. Going forward, **parent communication to school will not change**. Parents should continue to follow our Communications Policy and contact the school office by email or phone when needed, including if you would like to contact your child's class teacher.

Over the next week or so, parents and carers will receive an **invitation link** to join ClassDojo. Although ClassDojo will not be in use until Monday 9th February, please follow the link so you are set up and ready to go as soon as possible.

Class Dojo will be used for the Story section and one-way teacher messages, celebrating learning and sharing...



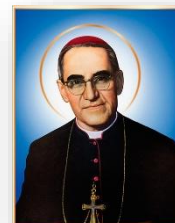
Oscar Romero Competition

Lunchtimes at Sacred Heart – Eating, good habits and manners

Over the past few weeks, we have introduced a few small changes to our dinner hall routines. These are designed to help the children develop good table manners, enjoy their social time together respectfully, eat more of their lunch / school dinner, and reduce the amount of food being wasted. This is part of our global responsibility, following Catholic teaching, to be respectful of our common home.

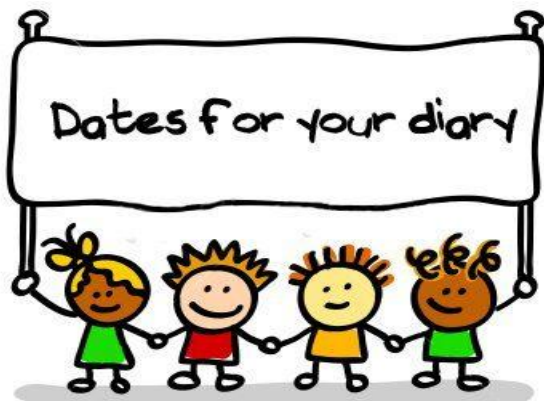
We have noticed that some children are rushing through their meals so they can get outside to play, and in some cases walking away from the table while still eating a mouthful of food. This often leads to food being dropped or left behind for our midday supervisors to clear away. We have also seen whole sandwiches, full packets of crisps, cheese strings, and even a completely wrapped pain au chocolat thrown in the bin. We want to support the children in making better choices and understanding the importance of eating well during the school day. Food they do not eat will remain in their box for them to bring home so you can monitor what your child is eating and what they enjoy.



To help with this, children are expected to remain seated until they have finished their meal. When they are done, they simply put their hand up and a midday supervisor will let them know when they are able to leave the table. They will be praised for eating well. We are encouraging children to eat the main part of their lunch first (sandwiches or hot meal), followed by fruit or other items.

If you include a treat in your child's lunchbox, please keep chocolate bars small in size and limited to one item. A good lunch really does make a difference to their energy, focus, and wellbeing throughout the afternoon, so please do talk to your child about the importance of eating enough.

Finally, many children would benefit from practising using a knife and fork correctly. This is an important life skill and also supports the development of fine motor skills. Please do support your child with this.
